


The wisest thing I ever heard is that the value of your life must be determined by the ability of your perseverance. This life is saturated with opportunity, we must aim not to let that pass us by.

We can do the impossible, we only need to believe.




Libertatis Per Scentia






Well done to our learners that won medals at the athletics event (2 gold, 2 silver, 5 bronze).

Focusing on the Importance of Learning

 Talk positively about the importance of education.

Let your child see how much you enjoy and value learning.

It is OK if you do not have all the answers to your child's questions, but it is important to show that you know how to find the answers.

 Learning builds confidence; and a child who is confident is more open to new opportunities to learn.

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Providing Homework Support

Set a regular time each day for doing homework. That time should be free of distractions such as TV and phone calls.

- Be sure your child has a place to do homework that is quiet and well lit. Make sure all the appropriate materials -such as paper and pencils -are available.
- Let your child know that homework is important and valuable. Consistently review your child's homework during homework time.

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Communicating With The School Year-Round

 Stay attuned to your child's academic accomplishments on a weekly basis. Praise those accomplishments appropriately.

 Communicate with the school regularly. When you have a concern or question, write a note, or email or phone the teacher. We need you on our team!

Think ahead: at the end of the school year, schedule a meeting to discuss with the teacher your child's successes and challenges.
