Chunking

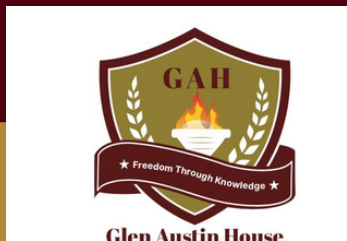
Make connections between keypoints to make a single memory chunk
